

PE and Sport Premium Spending at Sheringdale

- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

Impact

- Increased PE participation including after school clubs
- Very high participation in local and National PE events: 86% of Year 6 children and 83% of Year 5 children represented the school in a competitive sport.

- We entered 16 competitions in eight different sports throughout the year reaching the finals of the London Youth at Crystal Palace Games in hockey
- Improved PE equipment and facilities
- A very high standard of PE teaching within the schools as recognised by OFSTED and the LA Inspector.
- Achieved Healthy Schools London Silver, November 2017.
- Maintained School Games Silver Award in July 2018.
- Both year 3 classes swam for a term and a half during the year. Each week they received an hour's lesson from a qualified Swim England Coach.
- By the end of the year, 73% of children could perform front crawl and backstroke to a good standard and 24% could swim a length of 25m unaided.
- Several children who had never been swimming before were able to put their faces in the water and enjoy moving about in the shallow end and practising front crawl.
- 67% of 2018 Year 6 could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- 36% of 2018 Year 6 could use a range of strokes effectively [front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke].

Sheringdale Primary School Sports Vision

At Sheringdale Primary School we aim to provide high quality physical activity during the school day as well as extra-curricular opportunities. Physical Education develops pupils' physical competence and confidence as well as their ability to develop these skills to perform a range of activities. For children between the ages of four and eleven it is vital that P.E. is taught regularly and to a high standard.

The school currently provides a minimum of 2 hours of P.E. every week for children in KS2 and 1½ for children in KS1 which is often boosted by the large amount of extra-curricular activities that are on offer throughout the year. The school has allocated 75% of a PE specialist teacher's time, to deliver PE lessons throughout KS1 and KS2. This is now supplemented by an HLTA PE specialist who teaches throughout the school.

Each summer we celebrate with a whole school Sports Day where every child takes part in a variety of track and field events and has the chance to compete and to win. We have done this for the last five years, the feedback is fantastic and we try to improve what we offer year on year.

In 2017-18, we had a large number of children participating across a range of competitive sports including; Athletics, Tag Rugby, Cricket, Cross Country, Football, Hockey, Netball and Rounders.

All these competitions are run by a number of providers. The Wandsworth School Games Association, run by Nick Miller organised the hockey tournament last year where our team won the and went on to represent the borough at the London Youth Games at Crystal Palace against 31 other teams from all around London. They battled through the sets of groups stages and then the knockout stages to reach the finals – an incredible result!

Other tournaments are run by Enable, Wandsworth Council's sports department and the Putney Primary Schools Sports Association (PPSSA) which has 16 member schools. This is a teacher-run organisation that arranges competitions in several sports throughout the year. They are very popular and well supported by children, staff and parents. Recently the school team won the PPSSA's annual Cross Country race after a stunning performance by our entire team.

Additionally, we have always enjoyed close sporting links with our neighbouring schools have arranged friendlies in various sports with Riversdale, St Michaels and Swaffield Schools. Last year we organised a mini festival for these schools at Southfields College and it was so popular it has developed in to the Wandle Sports Cluster These tournaments enable children

to play competitive matches when they might not normally get the chance to represent the school.

We are also continually promoting links with the wider sporting community so that children can further develop their interests and access the best opportunities around. Each year we receive coaching from the Wimbledon Junior Tennis Initiative and have good links with Southfields Tennis Club, Wandsworth Premier Football Club and Roehampton Cricket Club.

Finally, each term our equipment is assessed and new stock is brought to renew and replace it. We feel it is important that a substantial part of the budget is allocated towards this.
