It is test result time and Sheringdale has done incredibly well compared to the national picture in the Year 6 SATS.

Thanks to all the staff involved and for the great support from the families who have closely worked in partnership with the school. The children have all made fantastic progress because of their hard work.

Children across the school have made excellent progress in all subjects – we pride ourselves on a broad and rich curriculum and the outcomes have been remarkable this year. On average the outcomes in the subjects other than maths and English were 96% at the expected level and 53% at greater depth.

The school is constantly evolving and growing; we look forward to the next phase of the expansion with an additional 30 places in September.
