

PE and Sport Premium Spending at Sheringdale

Updated October 2021

Each year we publish a report outlining the ways in which we spent last year's government PE and Sport funding, how we plan to spend this year's allocation and how it benefits the pupils at Sheringdale. Obviously due to Covid-19 many of our plans were put on hold or simply cancelled so the total spend last year did not match the projected budget.

Sheringdale Primary School Sports Report

At Sheringdale Primary School we aim to provide high quality physical activity during the school day as well as extra-curricular opportunities. Physical Education develops pupils' physical competence and confidence as well as their ability to develop these skills to perform a range of activities. For children between the ages of four and eleven it is vital that P.E. is taught regularly and to a high standard.

The school currently provides a minimum of 2 hours of P.E. every week for children in KS1 and KS2 which is often boosted by the large amount of extra-curricular activities that are on offer throughout the year. The school has employed two HLTA PE specialists who teach PE throughout the school.

One of our key targets this year is to improve the provision of playtime activities and we are investing in both staff training and equipment.

Sadly, in 2020-21, a large amount of competitive sports were cancelled either due to weather or Covid-19. On a positive note, school sports are now up and running and we are planning a full program of events throughout the year
