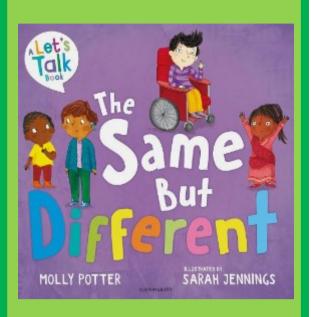


Weekly Message
