Sheringdale Primary School Sports Report

At Sheringdale Primary School we aim to provide high quality physical activity during the school day as well as extra-curricular opportunities. The school provides 2 ½ hours of P.E. every week for children in KS1 and KS2 which is often boosted by the large amount of extra-curricular activities that are on offer throughout the year. The school employs a team of 2 specialists to deliver PE.

We have a full schedule of competitions booked in for the year. We are taking advantage of the increasing amount of opportunities for girls to compete in a variety of sports. This has increased the enthusiasm and demand for clubs and extra training. We will continue to enter other competitions and festivals that will offer valuable experiences to many children from Year 1 to Year 6.
